





Upward trend for Yr 3. Yr 3 above National Standard.


Yr 5 below National; however, Year 5 have made significant improvement since Year 3 testing.





St Matthew's School's mean score for Year 5 2018 was 468.8 in comparison to St Matthew's School's mean score for Year 5 2017 which was 541.5.

The mean score for Year 3 2018 was 454 in comparison to St Matthew's School's mean score for Year 3 2017 which was 402.3.

- a) The Principal of the school as an ex-officio member,
- b) The Parish Priest as an ex-officio member,
- c) Between four and six elected persons
- d) A nominee from the Parish Council, and
- e) A nominee from the P&F.
- f) The Board may co-opt up to 2 additional persons
